



Bathroom floors need to be water and moisture resistant. Some materials are particularly suitable for this purpose.




STONE is particularly durable and elegant, and, once sealed, repels stains. Slate, marble, and granite lend a highly sophisticated look.

CERAMIC TILES are versatile and hard-wearing; they are stain-resistant, withstand bumps and scratches, and repel water and moisture. Tiles can be arranged in many different ways to create beautiful and stylish effects. Be careful not to choose tiles with very smooth or glossy finishes, which will become slippery and hazardous when wet.

All floating flooring such as laminate, wood and vinyl, are better be installed with an underlay. It protects against moisture and is a great sound barrier. Some underlay can also correct small subfloor irregularities.

KITCHEN

CONSIDERATIONS FOR KITCHEN FLOORS – Spilled food, high heels, toys on wheels, knocks, scrapes, and scuffs: the kitchen floor is certainly put to the test! All the more reason to choose a tough, easy-to-clean, and comfortable floor covering. Avoid surfaces that are too smooth; they become slippery and dangerous as soon as a few drops of water are spilled. When you




